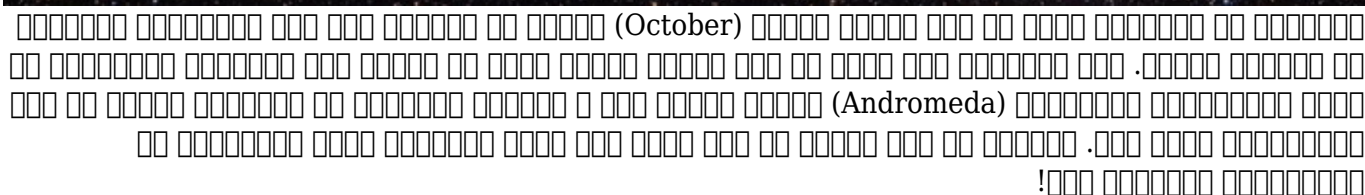
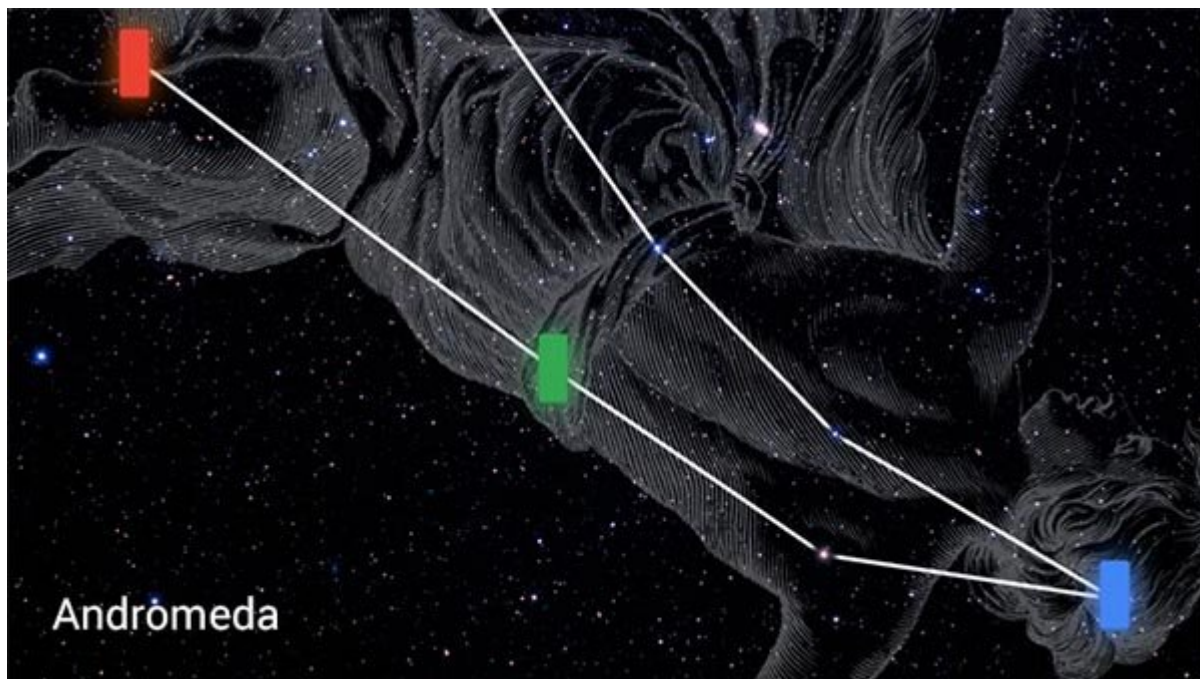


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Andromeda constellation is a large constellation in the northern sky. It is named after the princess Andromeda from Greek mythology. The constellation is visible from the Earth's Northern Hemisphere and is one of the 48 constellations listed by the 2nd-century astronomer Ptolemy. It is located between the constellations of Cassiopeia and Perseus. The constellation is home to several bright stars, including Alpheratz (alpha Andromedae), which is a double star. The constellation is also home to the Andromeda Galaxy (M31), which is the closest major galaxy to the Milky Way.
